



Jump into water activities like paddleboards and snorkel or even learn some navigation fundamentals.

You cast off at dawn for the Marietas Islands, on an excursion that takes you to one of the most exclusive, spectacular and rarely visited places in the entire Republic of Mexico. You arrive at this bit of maritime heaven aboard a motorboat known as an APEX. Immediately following this brief crossing, you'll be sinking into soft sands on Playa de los Enamorados and will start to take in all the enchantment of the islands' rough beauty plus its incredible marine life. Gaily colored tropical fish, exotic birds and, with luck, humpback whales will mean you'll remember this unparalleled paradise for the rest of your life.



Starting from the wharf at Punta Mita, this journey takes you close to some of the most impressive sea creatures anywhere, specifically humpback whales. Using a hydrophone—an electric sound transmitter for underwater purposes—you'll hear these giants' songs as you marvel before their huge leaps from the water and learn everything about them from participating marine biologists. We think you'll come away seeing it as a safari you've got to experience at least once.




