

A UNIQUE ELEGANCE WITH AN ARTISTIC SPIRIT

Each Maisons Pariente hotel addresses attaches great importance to the arts and Le Grand Mazarin takes this passion for art to a new dimension with nearly 500 works scattered across the hotel.

With Martin Brudnizki's original décor concept, the hotel then collaborated with both renowned French artisans and young talent to create contemporary frescoes, lighting, and paintings. In doing so, Le Grand Mazarin pays tribute to the illustrious artistic pedigree of Paris while also evoking the 17th-century literary salons of the Marais, where Ladies of the society would host gatherings in their private mansions, bringing together some of the most inspiring minds of the era.




Martin Brudnizki: French classicism reimagined by the most British of Swedish designers

The historic 14th-century building that is now home to Le Grand Mazarin boasts a refined yet eclectic décor thanks to the signature style of acclaimed designer Martin Brudnizki and is characterized by its quirky and surprising touches. The 61 rooms and suites, restaurant, bars, winter garden, wellness area and swimming pool all reflect the designer's sumptuous and intimate vision. Think antique furniture, vintage objects, seashells embedded in the wallpaper or the custom-designed rugs which are a joyful patchwork of opulent fabrics with baroque details (lobsters hidden in the design, for example). In the hotel's lobby, a splendid wedding wardrobe typical of 19th-century Europe sets the tone – Brudnizki himself discovered it in England. In every corner of Le Grand Mazarin, the designer has mixed styles with beautiful materials, demonstrating his incomparable talent and unlimited imagination.









"I love the concept of the literary salon of yesteryear; the Salonnières were one of the main sources of inspiration when designing Le Grand Mazarin. We wanted the hotel to give the impression of having always been part of the Marais landscape. We were inspired by the great houses of the aristocratic era, where personalities from literature, art and music gathered together in sumptuous residences to indulge in the pleasures of letters and fine conversation. Our concept of Le Grand Mazarin was to revive this atmosphere and adapt it to contemporary times, where guests feel at home and have the freedom to express themselves."

Brudnizki and Maisons Pariente have called upon the skills of some of France's greatest craft houses, particularly those marked as Entreprise du Patrimoine Vivant (EPV), (Living Heritage Companies) the signature of excellence designated by the French state. These artisans still work with the same traditional handmade methods honed by previous generations: Le Grand Mazarin has worked with Maison Pierre Frey for fabrics, Maison Lucien Gau on bronzeworks, Henryrot & Cie for furniture, Art de Lys for tapestry canopies, Pinton 1867 for rugs and Ateliers Gohard for paintings. Each element has been carefully considered to give life to a world as luxurious as it is charming. Unique in both style and ambience, Le Grand Mazarin reverberates with soul.






SUPPORTING THE NEW GENERATION OF ARTISTIC TALENT

Le Grand Mazarin is proud to have offered space for young artists to express themselves, so they can continue writing the rich artistic history of the Marais within the walls of this centuries-old building.

Jacques Merle

Gallery Maestria. A graduate from Duperré School in Paris in 2015, Jacques Merle created Le Grand Mazarin's swimming pool fresco, which evokes the myth of Narcissus. Inspired by tales and myths, the artist's work combines poetry, nostalgia and dreamlike images. Surrounded by flowers and hand-painted trees, the pool is immersed in greenery and overlooked by the character of Narcissus, who stares down on bathers from the vaulted ceiling. The swimming pool is an invitation to dream and find yourself; halfway between the imagination of Jean Cocteau and Antoine de Saint-Exupéry.





Sophia Pega, in Wonderland

Like Alice falling through a rabbit hole, Menorcan-born artist Sophie Pega invites us to follow her into her fantastic *trompe-l'œil* universe, where swans, horses and unicorns meet among infinite staircases, fanciful roses and extravagant trees. Inspired by the architectural motifs of the Marais, she has dressed Le Grand Mazarin's winter garden with 12 celestial windows inspired by tarot cards opening onto an imaginary dream world where everything is possible.









Ateliers Gohard, decorative painting

The Living Heritage Company Ateliers Gohard has been creating decorative painting, material effects and gilding for more than 60 years, with previous projects including the Statue of Liberty, Palace of Versailles and the Dôme des Invalides. For Le Grand Mazarin, Ateliers Gohard has created the stunning ceilings inside the Boubalé bar/restaurant. With their patina effects and plant motifs, the ceilings look as if they've been lifted from an eastern Europe dacha. Ateliers Gohard has also hand-crafted Boubalé's wooden seats and other pieces of furniture.




Amélie Maison d'Art, artistic curator of Le Grand Mazarin

The selection of art that Amélie du Chalard, founder of contemporary gallery Amélie Maison d'Art, has curated for Le Grand Mazarin fuses genres, mediums and eras, which immediately harmonizes with the hotel's atmosphere. Antique objects and canvases, large vintage mirrors, photographs, collages and paintings on wood from eastern Europe coexist like a comforting-yet-charming cabinet of curiosities. The eye gets happily lost contemplating of a joyous cocktail of works and memories, which intrigue and delight at the same time. The paintings include works by Charlotte Culot, Vesna Vrdoljak, Emelie Törling, Janine Marca and Claude Bonin-Pissaro, among many others. Collaborating closely with Leslie Kouhana and Kimberley Cohen, Amélie du Chalard had fun bringing together generations of artists and different styles. This dialogue between the works conjures a world out of time, that is both anchored in the past and embodies an extreme modernity.

"Le Grand Mazarin is the first urban hotel open all year round in the Maisons Pariente collection and it represented a real challenge for us. Paris is our hometown, the Marais, the neighborhood that welcomed our grandparents arriving from Poland. We wanted to embody the real Paris: avantgarde but rooted in its history. With this in mind, we embarked on an epic quest to decorate the hotel, visiting the flea market in Vanves, Saint-Ouen and Normandy, with Leslie and I validating each object, work and piece of furniture. As such, Le Grand Mazarin now lives up to its vocation as a private mansion that has always been there and will always be there: reassuring, fun, impertinent."

The Maisons Pariente spirit





Boubalé is the tender name for "my little doll, my little darling" in Yiddish, a favorite expression of Ashkenazi grandmothers. All the soul of Boubalé is there, magnified by the Michelin-starred Israeli chef Assaf Granit.

Boubalé tells this beautiful love story that has passed through the kitchen since the dawn of time. A story that began on the borders of eastern Europe, traveled to Jerusalem before stopping in Paris, in the Marais. Without losing the essential, the taste for sharing. At Boubalé, nothing is too generous, nothing is too warm. Boubalé takes your feelings on an unforgettable journey into a little-known Ashkenazi culture, twirling like a violin tune, and as light as an improvised party between friends. Boubalé is the new beating heart of the Marais, a heart beating to the crazy rhythm of the joy of living and the happiness of sharing real emotions. More than a restaurant, Boubalé is a place dedicated to the ultimate pleasure of being together.

An unexpected gourmet journey

From Poland, Russia, Germany, Georgia, Lithuania and Ukraine, Ashkenazi grandmothers made the journey to Israel. When they arrived, they shared their recipes with their neighbors, from Morocco or Syria, Iraq or elsewhere. This is how the kitchen lives. This is how differences turn into real wealth. Boubalé gives life to these memories and then writes a new chapter of the odyssey.

At Boubalé, Michelin-starred chef Assaf Granit pays homage to his childhood memories, his heritage and this family tradition, faithfully perpetuated over the centuries. In turn, he wanted to bring a serving of refined creativity to a cuisine that comes from the depths of the soul. Boubalé dares the improbable: giving a contemporary sensuality to specialties deemed austere, by the sheer force of memory and talent. The menu dares to honor the mythical dishes of the little-known Ashkenazi cuisine. It took courage for Granit to make this storied cuisine sexy and glamorous and Boubalé has risen beautifully to the challenge of giving Ashkenazi cuisine back its long awaited nobility. Assaf Granit, a dazzling journey

Twelve restaurants in his Jerusalem hometown, one in London and five in Paris, including the Michelin-starred Shabour, chef Assaf Granit is an iconic figure of new Israeli cuisine. He has blown up culinary conformism in the Middle East and Europe to create its own mix of flavors, compiling the best of both worlds. Granit's creations also reflects his family history, mixing oriental nostalgia with Polish classics in an irresistible gourmet bazaar, a high-flying exercise that only a virtuoso of the kitchen can dare to achieve. It's all underwritten by a palpable enthusiasm, the signature of the chef's other restaurants around the world. Boubalé occupies a special place in Granit's heart; a moving journey to his origins.

Festive feasts

We enter Boubalé through the back door of a dream. The dream of an almost forgotten world, an esoteric art of living that exudes rare authenticity. 


